We will be welcoming back one of our <u>favourite Clinical Psychologists</u> <u>Steve Den Kaat</u>, who will attend and co-present with <u>Dr Hugh Walker</u>, another Clinical Psychologist from "Diverse Minds Psychology Clinic".

As a response to some suggestions from ASPIA, they will focus their presentation on "<u>First</u> <u>Contact and Broaching Diagnosis</u>". The whole issue of suggesting Aspergers to a partner, and then approaching the process of diagnosis is a minefield in itself, often provoking great anxiety, further traumatic encounters, and not always good outcomes.

They will cover questions, such as: what a partner needs to know before broaching the subject with their AS partner, what info they need to give to the psychologist, how to bring up the topic of possible diagnosis with their AS partner, etc.

<u>Biographical Information</u>: Steve is the director and supervisor of the team at Diverse Minds Psychology Clinic in Erskineville, Sydney.

Steve obtained his MSc (psych) from Victoria University of Wellington, with his research in the field of Autism Spectrum Conditions (http://hdl.handle.net/10063/713). He completed his clinical training under the supervision of Professor Tony Attwood, Dr Michelle Garnett and Dr Hui Keow Lim.

Steve is a clinical psychologist who has a keen interest in working with adolescents with complex challenges including: attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, conduct disorder, eating disorders, anxiety, and depression. Steve's main area of specialty is in the area of Asperger's Syndrome and autism spectrum conditions.

Steve has provided diagnostic services and therapy in response to varying psychological needs. He has worked alongside children, adolescents and adults across the autism spectrum. In addition, Steve has presented across Australia and internationally in the area of autism spectrum conditions, with a focus on self-Identity and self-esteem.
